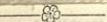

**Saturday, April 3rd**—Swallow Falls, Cyfyng, Moel Siabod, Dolwyddelan, Pont y pant, Sarn Helen. 16½ miles. The climb of Moel Siabod can be avoided if desired.

**Sunday, April 4th**—Train to Dolwyddelan, Pwyll y garth, Penmachno, Ispytty-Ifan, Rydd Llanfair, Capel Garmon. 17 miles.

**Monday, April 5th**—Train or bus to Llanrwst, Pentre tufarn and secondary road across country to Colwyn Bay. 15 miles.

**Or**

Bus to Capel Curig, Llyn Cowlyd, Llanbedr y cennin, Tal y cafn Station. 17 miles. This would lead to the parts where the recent dam-break occurred.

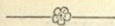
